As part of this course students will go out on intensive week blocks as a class excursion to various cattle stations to participate in industry work experience under the supervision of the trainer

About this course

This qualification describes the skills and knowledge for general job roles in agriculture including livestock production, cropping or in the case of mixed farming workplaces, both cropping and livestock.

In this course students will be working on a mixed-produce farm, acquiring skills and knowledge in livestock handling, rearing new born and young livestock, horse riding suitability and care, pasture management, conventional fencing and working with farm machinery. This course includes work experience at various cattle stations across the Top End.

This qualification runs over the full year with an expected completion time of two semesters on campus. Students are to attend the course three full days per week on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday.

Program content

This qualification consists of sixteen units of competency from the Agriculture, Horticulture and Conservation and Land Management Training Package.

Study and career pathways

On completion of this qualification, students may continue their studies with the Certificate IV in Agriculture. Taminmin College does not offer this qualification as it is not suitable for VETiS delivery.

Assessment

Assessments are completed both during classroom sessions and after the work experience component. Assessments vary with each unit of competency and include demonstrations, observation, questions and answers, portfolios and case studies. Students have a set date when assessments must be completed by.

How will you learn?

Training and assessment takes place on the rural farm at Taminmin College Campus. The course is delivered 3 days a week on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday during normal school hours. All resources are supplied however students will need to supply the following:

- Pen/pencil
- Notebook

Previous studies and skills recognition

Eligibility/entry requirements

To gain entry into this qualification, students must be enrolled in a senior secondary government or registered non-government school at year 12 level. All students will undergo an interview prior to acceptance into the course.

Fees

There is a fee of \$300.00 which includes all learner resources, assessments and covers the cost of all transport and camps (including food), show shirts and competition nominations. The fee is non-refundable following the second week of the course

This qualification is funded by the Northern Territory Government as Taminmin College utilises government funds to support student employment outcomes.

Exit Points

Students may withdraw from this qualification at any time by completing a Withdrawal form and receive a Statement of Attainment for any units of competency successfully completed.
